



#### New Print 21 Printmaking Festival

In conjunction with the City of Newcastle's *New Annual* Arts Festival (12-21 February 2021), Newcastle Printmakers will be holding our inaugural printmaking festival at the workshop on 19<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> February 2021. It will be an opportunity for novice, amateur and professional printmakers to learn, connect, and explore the world of printmaking through an exhibition, live demonstrations, artist talks, and contributing to a large-scale collaborative print.

On Friday night, join us from 5pm as we open our festival with an exhibition, live music, conversation and drinks. February (last day of the festival)






#### **Etching Collaboration**

Chris Clifton & Michelle Hallinan will be leading a large zinc plate etching collaboration; participants will be able to contribute to a large line-bite etching of a Newcastle themed landscape. People will be able to add to this plate throughout the whole festival and then it will be etched and printed on the Sunday of the festival.

#### **Screenprint Collaboration**

Catherine Tempest will be leading a large-scale screen-print of a Newcastle themed landscape. It will be made using paper stencils, and around 3 colours – to be printed on the Sunday of the festival.

REDHEAD BEACH FEB 6<sup>th</sup> 9am to 2pm



Long overdue, but here is the first social gathering of the Night Printers Social Club for 2021. Covid put a stop to this fledgling social club last year, but not this time! Members of NPW are invited to join us on Saturday 6th February 9am to 2pm at the Shark Tower on REDHEAD BEACH for a free guided 'en plein air' experience.

Chris Clifton will provide guidance on the use of sugar lift on etching plates to create graphic depictions of the landscape. All you need to bring is a degreased aluminium plate, paint brushes, your drawing skills, the usual clothing for a day outdoors, and some food and drink. I will provide all other materials. We will be able to etch our plates but not print them. This can be done at the workshop in your own time. Members are able to bring a non-member if they wish as a guest, but they will need to become a member of they wish to print at the workshop.

ALTERNATIVELY: bring your own printmaking plate to do drypoint, linocut, woodcut, or even a non-print medium that could be turned into a Screenprinting stencil or solar plate...the possibilities are endless.





#### PRINT FESTIVAL:



#### **SHOP TALK!**

**STORAGE**: A dedicated, easily accessible storage space has been approved to encourage more use of screens. Smaller screens can hang in the dark room but for the bigger ones a simple stand will go above the filing cabinets in the kitchen.

#### **New Equipment:**

The University of Newcastle has very kindly donated some new equipment and supplies to NPW! We have successfully acquired the following items: rollers, lithography supplies (including lots of valuable stones), silk screens & squeegees, hot plate, workbench, canite boards, zinc sheets, rosin, telephone books, METAL GUILLOTINE, hydraulic trolly for lifting stones, large metal sink for wet area, and much more....

SCREEN RESERVATIONS: A reservation system has been suggested to improve the use of screens at the workshop. This will be a book to write your name and the number of the screen you want to use (the numbers are on the frames). The screen you have reserved can then be left in the darkroom after coating and in the screen storage area after exposing. These screens can be reserved for 2 weeks at a time and must stay at the workshop. Remember to tick the box in the reservation book when you have cleaned the screen and are done with it - Easy!

Cleaning up				
Clean all surfaces after use using the disinfectant and paper towels provided at the front counter. Also disinfectant sprays are available for spraying surfaces.
